What you'll learn

This course is designed as a continuation of the mapping science curriculum. Topics include:

- Surveying & judicial protocols for the ownership of property
- Review of simple & reverse curves
- Review of the Public Land Survey System
- In-depth review of aerial photogrammetry, use of LIDAR data, and oblique photography
- Explanation of various legal documents that affect ownership
- Explanation of principles that mappers follow in establishing property boundaries
- Basics of Geographic Information Systems (GIS)

This course includes an optional exam. Successful completion of the exam is required for Idaho students using the course to meet state certification requirements.
