# 7-hr National *USPAP* Update Course, (2024-25)

### Date and Time

Wednesday, November 19, 2025 (9:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. Mountain)

### Description

This 7-hour continuing education course from the Appraisal Foundation, focuses on *USPAP* requirements for ethical behavior and competent performance by appraisers.

The first part of the course addresses the changes to *USPAP*, which were effective on January 1, 2024, and the second part of the course focuses on case studies that challenge you on how to apply *USPAP* to situations that you encounter as an appraiser.

### Expectations for Online Workshop

- You should have a reliable, high-speed Internet connection.
- You should have access to headphones/microphone. Use of a computer's built-in headphones/microphone is discouraged.
- Students are required to be seen via a webcam throughout the entire course.
- This'll be an interactive online workshop, with the opportunity for students to directly engage with the instructor and ask questions.
